

Week 2 Ahead: September 10-16, 2017 (previous forecast below)




Comment: The outlook is dependent on influence of the tropics as Irma may strike the East or Southeast U.S. West and northwest of this potentially powerful hurricane the remainder of the U.S. is mainly drier-than-normal while the Northwest States maintain excessive heat risk.
