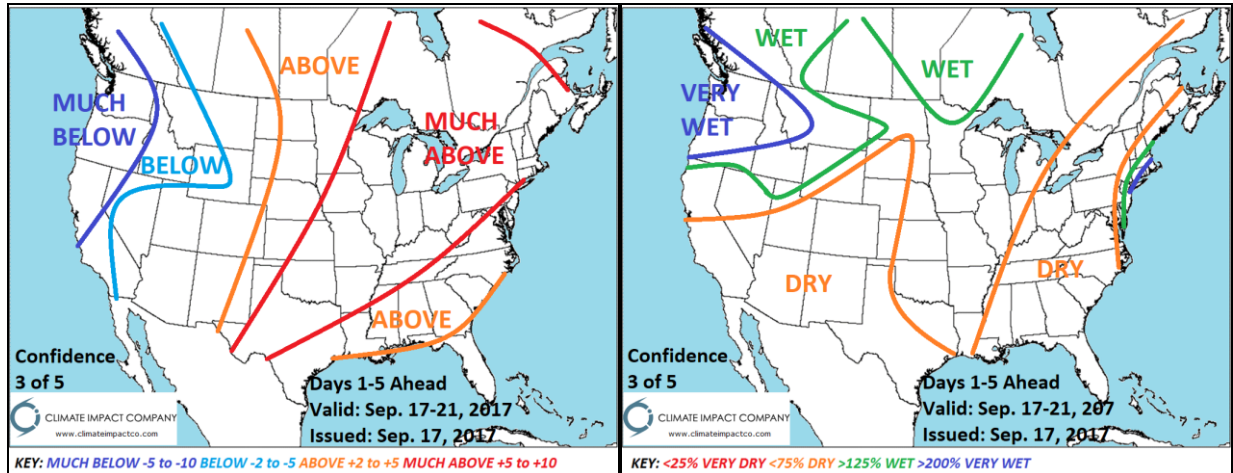


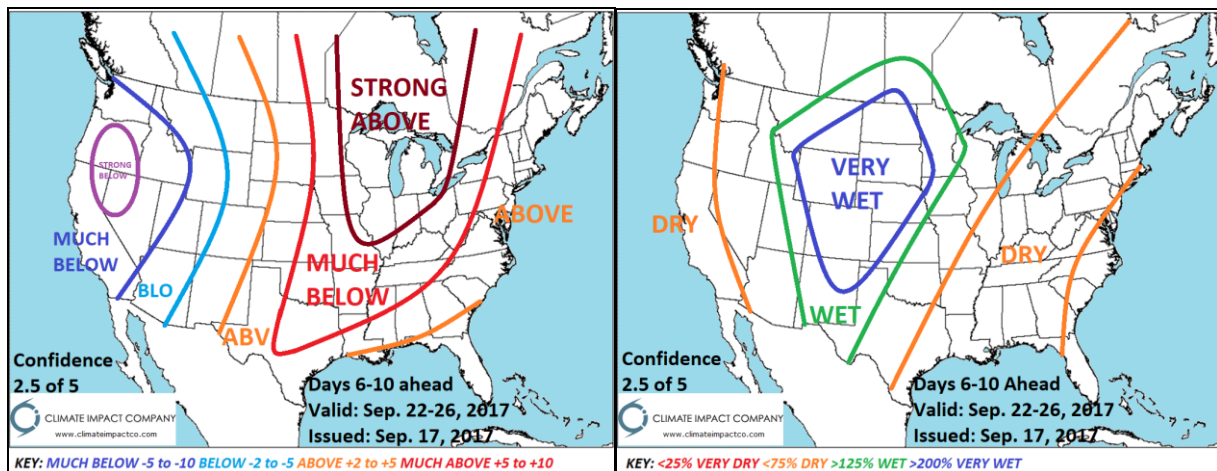
Climate Impact Company Sunday Report

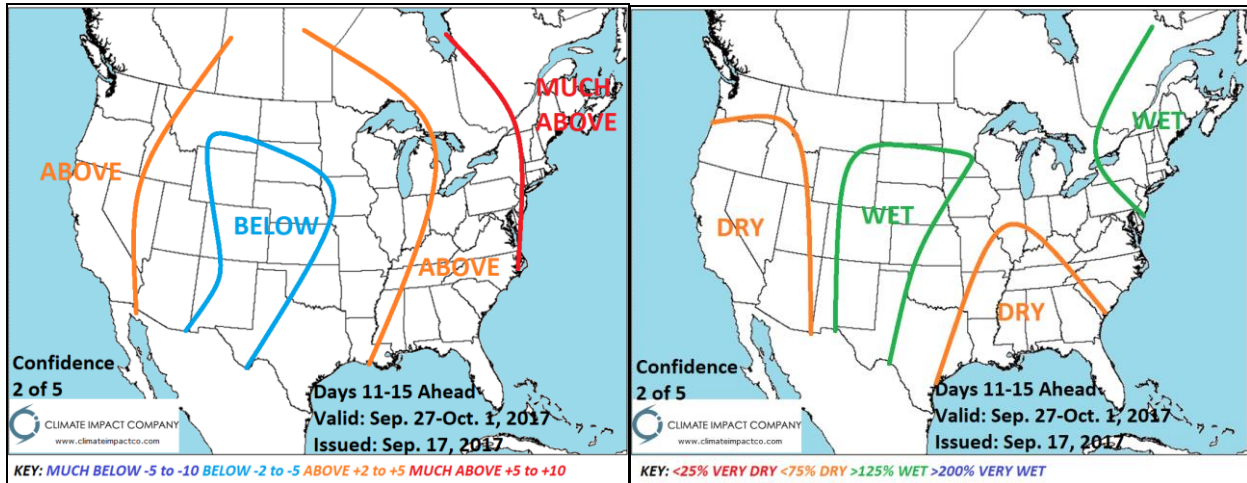
1. Day 1-5 Outlook (Sep. 17-21, 2017): Jose grazes southern New England.

- Hurricane Jose weakens with attendant rain/wind and high waves into the northern Mid-Atlantic/southern New England States TUE/WED.
- Continued wet and cool in the Northwest with early season snows.
- Very warm Central and East; warmest anomalies East-Central/Mid-South U.S.



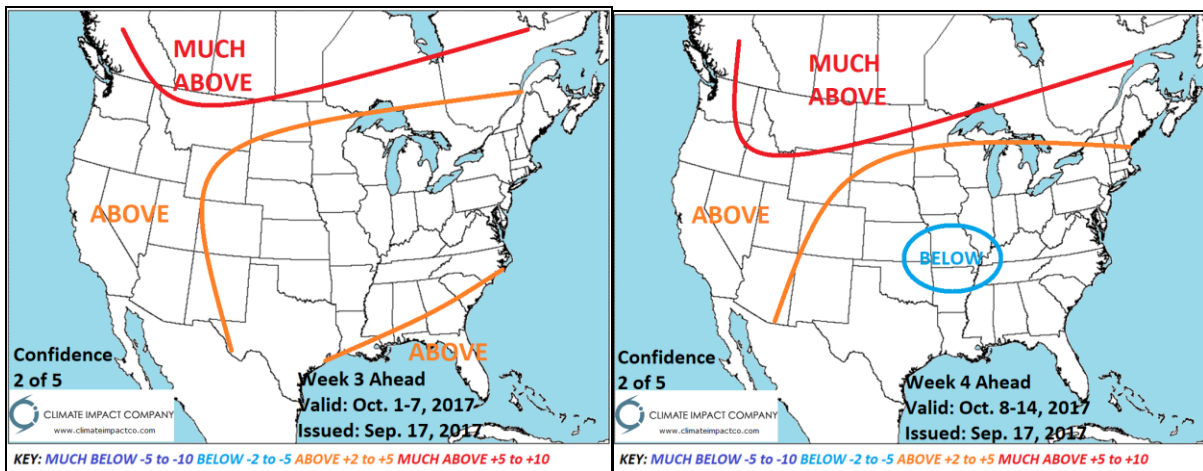
2. Day 6 to 10 Outlook (Sep. 22-26, 2017): Powerful eastern U.S. ridge.

- And equally powerful West U.S. trough as the western U.S. chill continues although the wet weather budesges east to the western Plains.
- Very warm Central into East (and dry).
- May be an issue Coastal Southeast with Hurricane Maria late period.



3. Day 11-15 Outlook (Sep. 27-Oct. 1, 2017): Lingering Eastern warmth.

- Influence of the tropics causes eastern U.S. to linger warm.
- Western chill shifts east and weakens although wet western Plains.
- Turning warmer West Coast.



4. Week 3 and 4 Outlook (Oct. 1-7/Oct. 8-14, 2017): Western rewarming.

- West turns warmer.
- Much warmer than normal Canada.
- Temperate Central/East, could be warmer.
