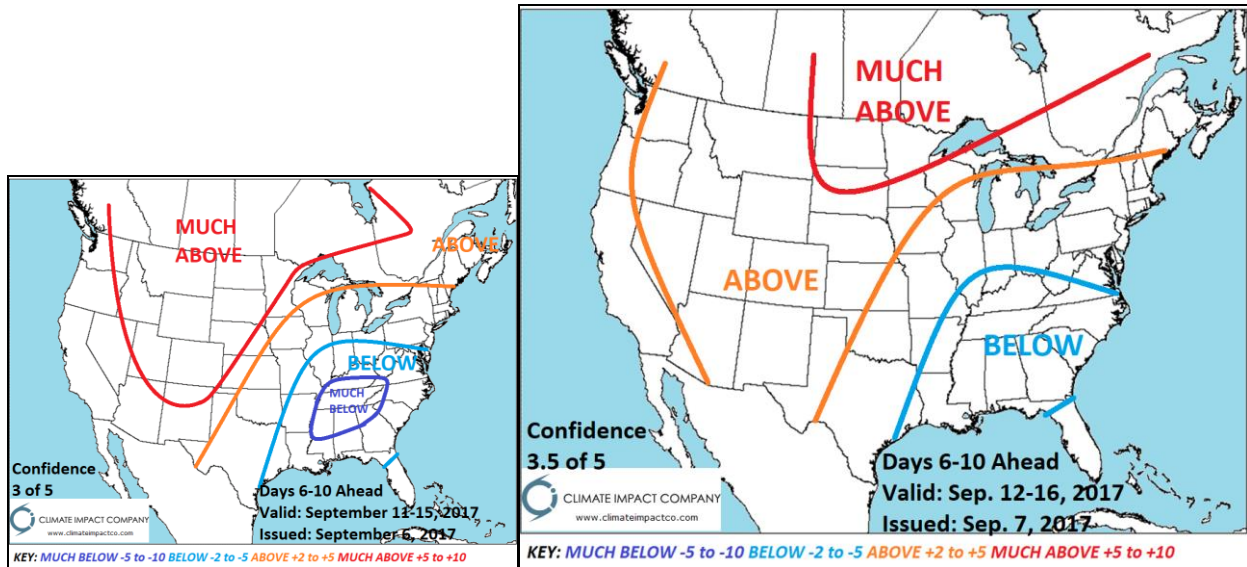


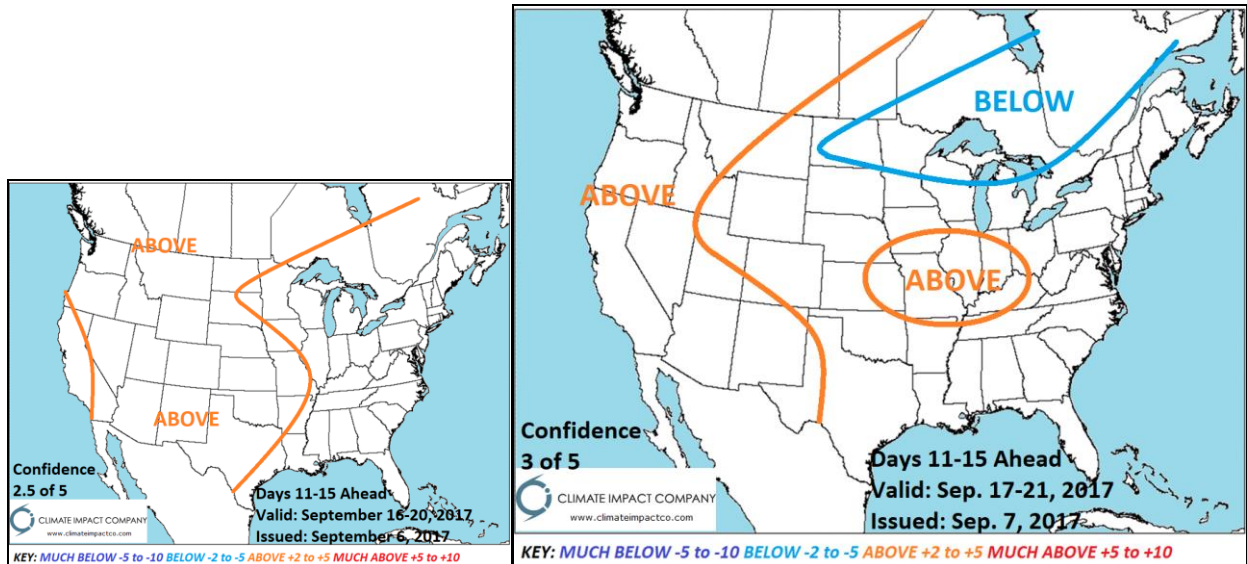

**Medium-range 6-10 Day Forecast Valid September 12-16, 2017 (yesterday's forecast left)**

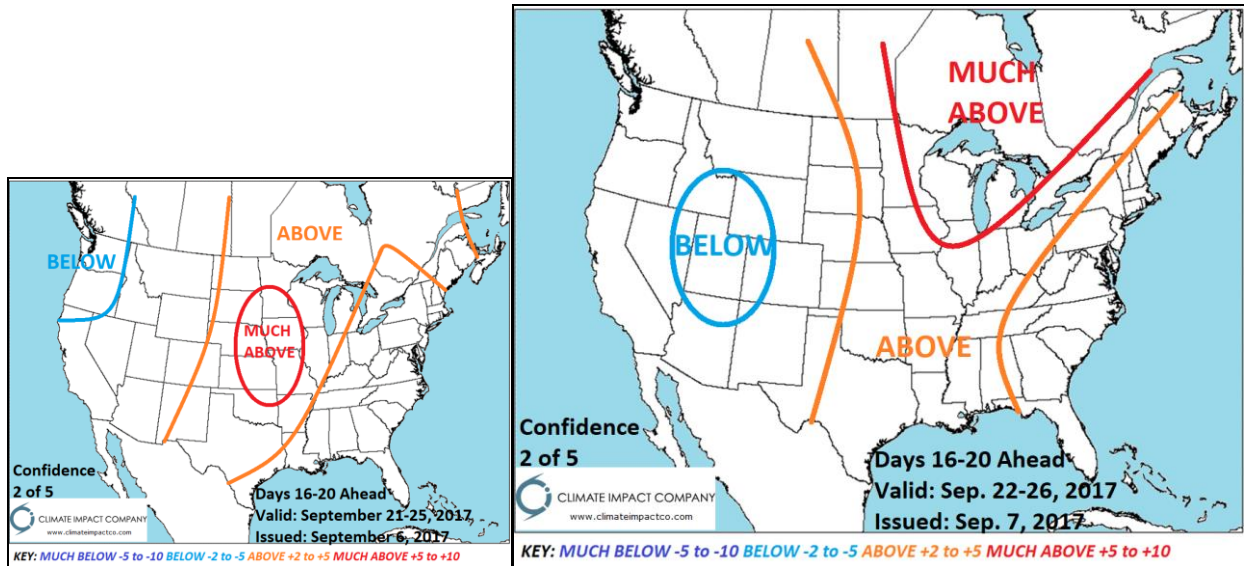


**Medium-range 11-15 Day Forecast Valid September 17-21, 2017 (yesterday's forecast left)**



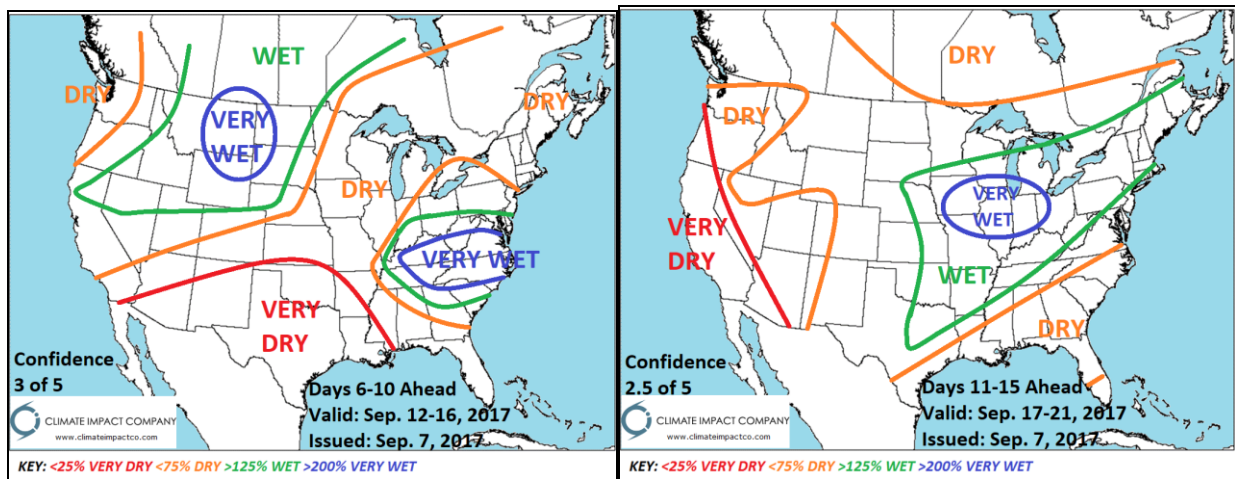
**Medium-range commentary:** Cool pattern hangs on in the Southeast during the 6-10 day period due to clouds associated with Irma. In the 11-15 day period a cold front bringing rain to the Central U.S. is trailed by cooler changes. The excessive heat in the West eases.

**Extended-range 16-20 Day Forecast Valid September 22-26, 2017 (yesterday's forecast left)**



**Extended-range commentary:** Wet weather in the West with cooler temperatures while the warm pattern shifts to the Midwest States.

**U.S. Medium-range Rainfall Anomaly Forecast for the U.S.**



**Discussion:** Irma's attendant rainfall is heaviest due to the stalling storm in the Mid-Atlantic region in the 6-10 day period. A new wet zone is introduced ahead of a cold front across the northwest Plains and Montana. In the 11-15 day period the Northwest rainfall shifts to the East-Central U.S. while the West turns dry again.
