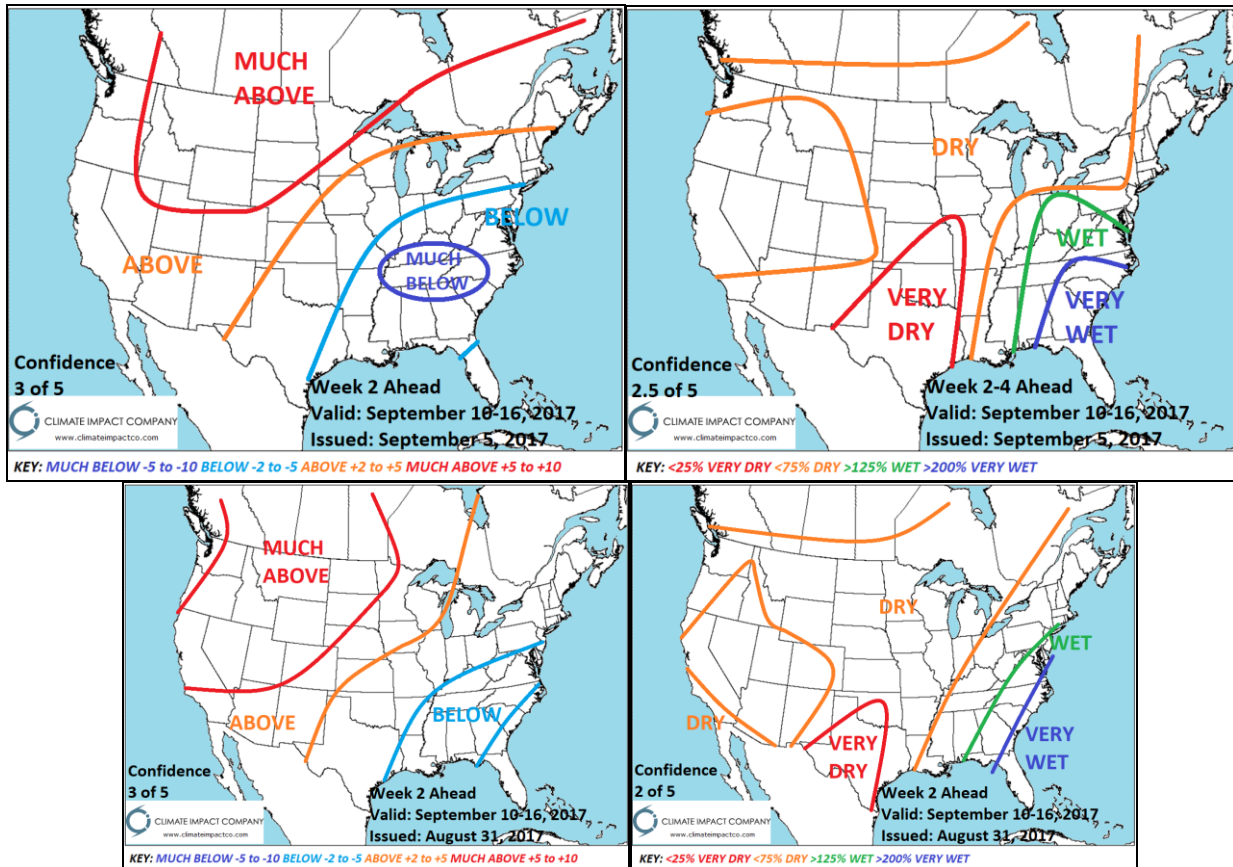


Climate Impact Company Intra-Seasonal (Week 2-4) Outlook for the U.S.

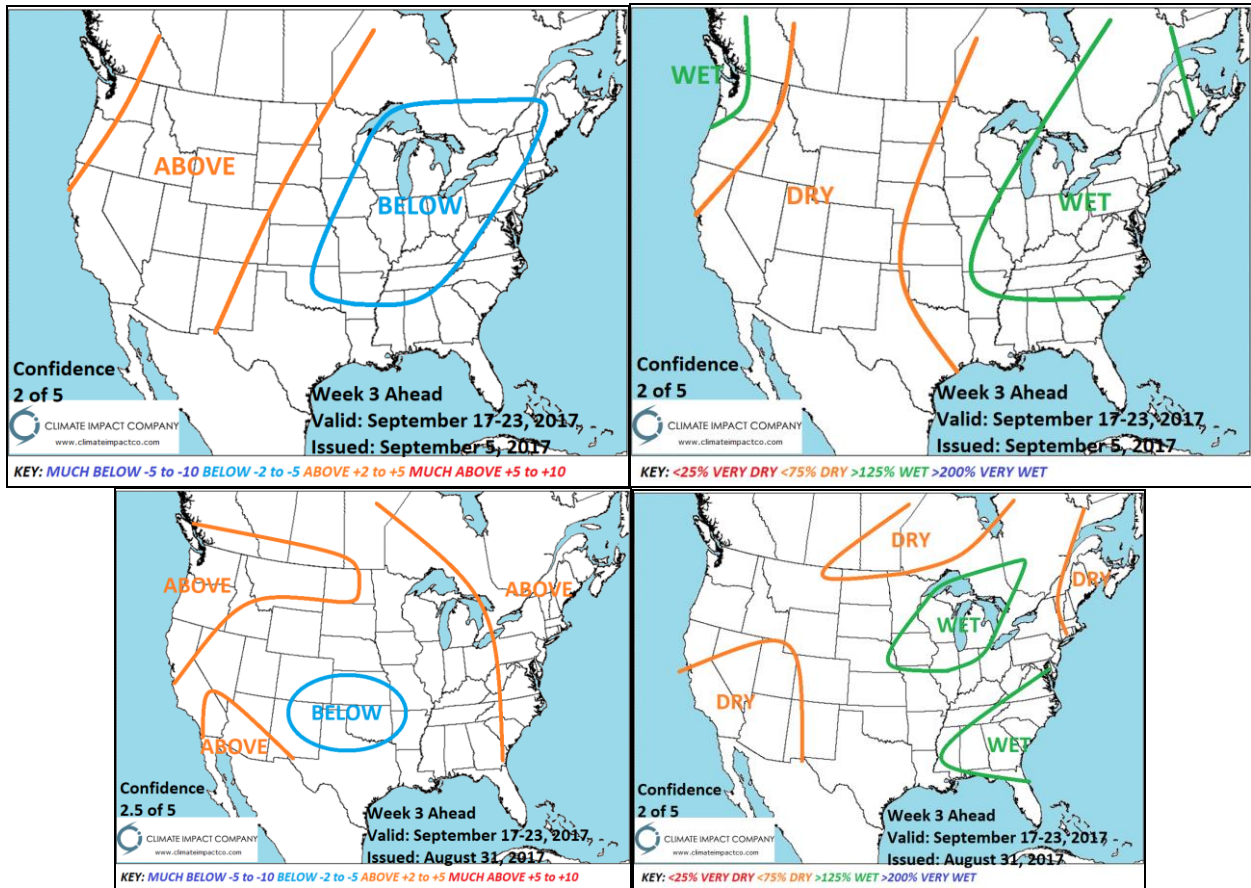

Week 2 Ahead: September 10-16, 2017 (previous forecast below)



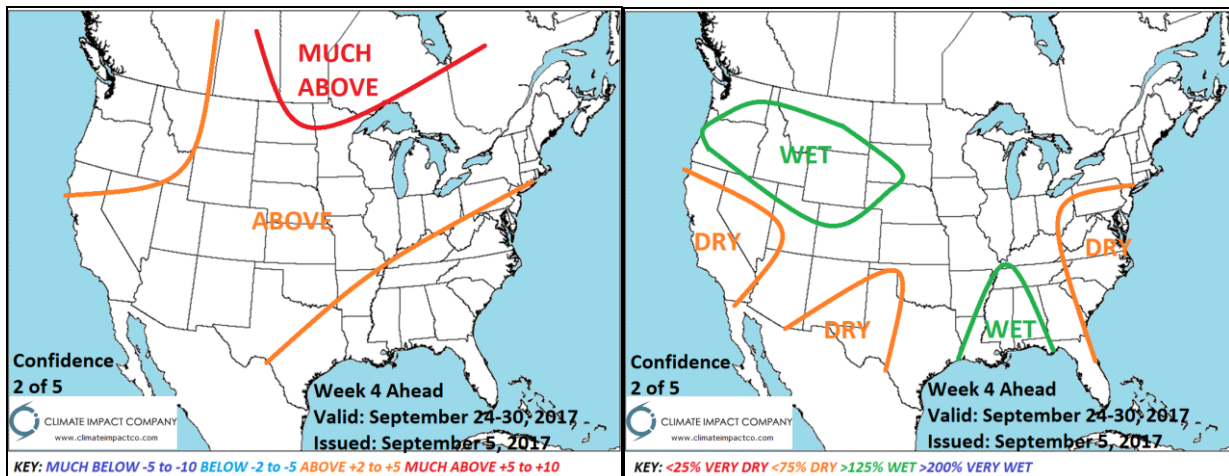
Comment: The impact of Irma on the U.S. climate determines prevailing weather during the 6-10 day period. Excessive rain is forecast across Florida and the Southeast U.S. West of Irma's track the central and western U.S. should be much drier than normal except for some shower/thundershower activity Interior West.

Week 3 Ahead: September 17-23, 2017 (previous forecast below)



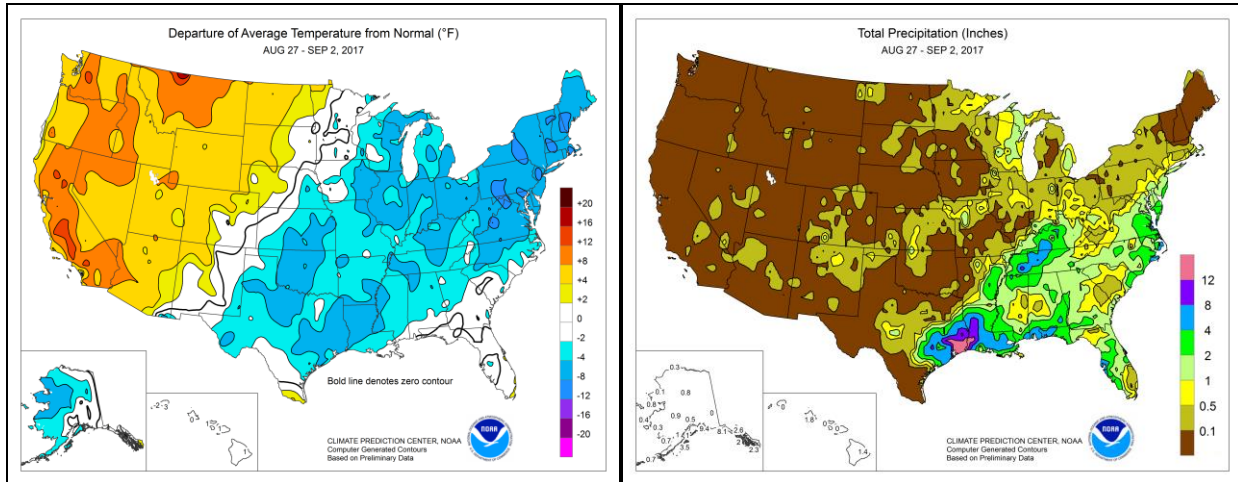
Comment: Wet weather in the East propelled by an emerging cool trough. The West is warm but not excessive.

Week 4 Ahead: September 24-30, 2017



Comment: Broad warmer-than-normal temperatures are forecast across the Plains.
